* * SUMMARY PARAGRAPHS EXPLAINING INMATE'S ATTAINED SCALE SCORES * *

TRUTHFULNESS SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:84

This inmate is defensive and guarded regarding self-disclosure. Truth-Corrected scale scores should be accurate, however, there is the possibility of some distortion. An attempt to present self in an overly favorable light is evident. Denial and resistance to further inquiry can be anticipated. This inmate is self-protective and minimizing self-report information.

ALCOHOL SCALE: LOW RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:39

Few, if any, indicators of alcohol (beer, wine or liquor) abuse are evident. Alcohol use, if present, may be historical or represent minimal involvement. Alcohol abuse risk is low. A person who does not drink may score higher than zero, but would score in the low risk range. With regard to alcohol, this is a low risk score.

DRUGS SCALE: MEDIUM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:67

An established pattern of drug use or abuse is not evident, however, there may be a "proneness" toward drug use or abuse. RECOMMENDATIONS: Important areas of inquiry include inmate records, as well as, history and pattern of use. Participation in Narcotics Anonymous, Cocaine Anonymous or an educational program could be helpful. This is a medium Drugs Scale score.

GAMBLING SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:74

This client scored in the Problem Risk (70 to 89th percentile) range. Problem risk scorers are typically in the early stages of gambler addiction or dependency. Gambling is a focal issue. If present, substance (alcohol and/or drugs) use or abuse could exacerbate the gambling cycle. Interview closely regarding history and pattern of gambling. Gambler's Anonymous (GA) or counseling would be beneficial. This client is either a "recovering" gambler (gambling problem but doesn't gamble anymore) or has a gambling problem.

JUDGMENT SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:79

Below average or perhaps impaired judgment is indicated. Impaired judgment is sometimes related to cultural factors, language difficulties, emotionality, intellectual functions, substance abuse or concrete thinking. This inmate may be easily confused and lacks understanding or comprehension.

DISTRESS SCALE: MAXIMUM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:97

A high level of distress is indicated. Suicidal ideation is likely. Compared to other inmates, this inmate is severely disturbed and manifests many symptoms of anxiety and/or depression. Feelings of anxiety, restlessness and depression are evident. Mood swings are common. This is a maximum risk Distress Scale score. A psychiatric or psychological evaluation might be considered.

VIOLENCE SCALE: MAXIMUM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:93

Violent tendencies are indicated and a pattern of violence appears to be well established. This inmate could be dangerous to self or others. Ruthlessness, destructiveness, savageness and explosiveness are

common. This is a violent person. This inmate can be intimidating, threatening and potentially dangerous. Review this inmate's records carefully for prior violent acts.

ANTISOCIAL SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE **RISK PERCENTILE:72**
 An established pattern of antisocial behavior is evident. Problem risk scorers often have difficulty maintaining responsible relationships and loyalties. They are often callous, irresponsible, distressed and lack empathy. Many are boastful, deceitful, antisocial and given to tantrums. Poor work histories are common. This is a problem risk (70 to 89th percentile) Antisocial Scale score.

ADJUSTMENT SCALE: MAXIMUM RISK RANGE **RISK PERCENTILE:94**
 This inmate's Adjustment Scale score is in the high risk (90 to 100th percentile) range. With regard to incarceration status and over-all adjustment this inmate is problem prone. Serious attitudinal and behavioral problems should be evident. **RECOMMENDATIONS:** Review this inmate's court history. This is a high Adjustment Scale score and adjustment (authority, interpersonal relationships, complaints and even disciplinary actions) problems should be evident. Consideration might be given to a psychiatric or psychological evaluation.

STRESS COPING SCALE: MAXIMUM RISK RANGE **RISK PERCENTILE:90**
 Poor stress coping abilities are evident. Stress or this inmate's ineffective coping abilities are likely contributing to a seriously impaired adjustment. Other emotional, psychological or mental health problems are likely. This inmate is not coping effectively with stress (anxiety, tension or pressure). Disorganization under stress may be a central problem. This inmate has serious stress coping problems and a psychiatric or psychological examination might be considered.
