TRUTHFULNESS SCALE: LOW RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:21
 This Truthfulness Scale score is in the low risk (zero to 39th percentile) range, which indicates that all other Juvenile Treatment Outcome (JTO) scale scores are accurate. Denial, problem minimization and attempts to "fake good" are minimal. This youth answered JTO items in an open, honest, cooperative and truthful manner. This Truthfulness Scale score is sound and credible.

ALCOHOL SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:72

This juvenile's Alcohol Scale score is in the Problem Risk (70 to 89th percentile) range, which means that alcohol use is problematic. Either an established pattern of alcohol abuse exists, or this youth is "recovering." If "recovering" determine how long they have been abstaining. Additional insight could be provided by the youth's "significant items," e.g., items #12, 38 and 68. Clarify this juvenile's history and pattern of drinking. Alcohol counseling and/or Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) involvement appear to be appropriate.

DRUGS SCALE: LOW RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:35

Few, if any, indicators of drug abuse are evident. This youth's Drugs Scale score is in the Low Risk (zero to 39th percentile) range. Low Risk scorers reveal very few indicators of illicit drug use or abuse. A youth that doesn't currently use drugs may score higher than zero, but would score in the Low Risk range. The Drugs Scale can be interpreted independently of other scale scores.

CONTROL SCALE: MEDIUM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:64

This youth's Control Scale score is in the Medium Risk (40 to 69th percentile). Medium Risk scorers can be overly sensitive to perceived criticism, frustration, rejection and stress. Emotions can interfere with judgment -- resulting in unpredictable behavior. Anger-management or peer group counseling might be helpful in avoiding escalation in "inappropriate" controlling behaviors.

VIOLENCE SCALE: MEDIUM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:57

This Violence Scale score is in the Medium Risk (40 to 69th percentile) range. This juvenile can be hostile, overly sensitive, reactive to perceived insults and quick tempered. Yet in comparable peer groups this youth would be viewed as "average" or even touchy -- but not violent. Available court records and other JTO scale scores (e.g., substance abuse, suicidal ideation, control, etc.) could help in understanding this juvenile's motivation and behavior.

SUICIDE SCALE: LOW RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:24

On the Suicide Scale this youth scored in the Low Risk (zero to 39th percentile) range. Low Risk scorers typically do not threaten or attempt suicide. Transient thoughts of death or dying are universal. Consequently, it is important to identify obsessive suicidal ruminations. When in doubt refer the youth for professional examination, observation and treatment as warranted.

OUTLOOK SCALE: MEDIUM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:65

This Outlook Scale score is in the Adaptable (40 to 69th percentile) range. Although this youth is usually positively responsive and adaptable, some negativism or pessimism is now apparent. Review other JTO scale scores to identify stressors and unresolved needs. More specifically, the Adjustment and Self-Esteem Scales can offer additional insights. However, treatment priorities would involve elevated (70th percentile and above) or severe (90 to 100th percentile) JTO scores like on the Suicide, Violence and Substance Abuse Scales.

DEPRESSION SCALE: MEDIUM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:65

This youth's Depression Scale score is in the Medium Risk (40 to 69th percentile) range. Some symptoms of depression are evident, however,

an established or profound depression is not present. Review other JTO scale scores for insight regarding stressors. Although not a focal issue, some symptoms of depression are present. Talk with this youth and take an interest in his/her life.

ANXIETY SCALE: MEDIUM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:50

This juvenile's Anxiety Scale score is in the Medium Risk (40 to 69th percentile) range. This youth reports average anxiety, tension or pressure. Anxiety is not a focal issue in this juvenile's overall adjustment. However, other JTO scale scores should be reviewed because they could represent other problems that might exacerbate this youth's anxiety.

ADJUSTMENT SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:72

This youth's Adjustment Scale score is in the Problem Risk (70 to 89th percentile) range. Many indicators of dissatisfaction and maladjustment are evident. This elevated score didn't occur by chance. This is a troubled youth with problems. Carefully review other JTO scale scores for problem and stressor identification. Recommendations include counseling (family or group).

STRESS COPING SCALE: LOW RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:34

This youth's Stress Coping Abilities Scale score is in the superior (zero to 39th percentile) range. This juvenile copes very well with stress. Stress refers to anxiety, tension and pressure. Unmanaged stress exacerbates emotional and mental health problem symptomatology. This scale is more than just a measure of "stress." It determines how well the youth "copes" with stress.

SELF-ESTEEM SCALE: MEDIUM RISK RANGE RISK PERCENTILE:55

This youth's self-esteem is intact. Medium Risk (40 to 69th percentile) scorers are usually self-confident and feel adequate. Self-esteem descriptive of the person one believes oneself to be. This youth has average self-esteem. Self-esteem reflects a youth's explicit valuing of self. It incorporates an attitude of acceptance-approval versus rejection-disapproval.

SIGNIFICANT ITEMS: The following self-report responses represent topics that may help in understanding the respondent's situation.
