SUMMARY PARAGRAPHS EXPLAINING OFFENDER'S ATTAINED SCALE SCORES

TRUTHFULNESS SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE **RISK PERCENTILE: 84**
This person is defensive and guarded regarding self-disclosure. However, "truth-corrected" scale scores should be accurate. A conscious or perhaps subconscious attempt to present self in an overly favorable light is evident. This individual is self-protective and minimizes self-report information.

ALCOHOL SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE **RISK PERCENTILE: 82**
Alcohol use and abuse are indicated. Either a pattern of alcohol abuse is indicated or this person is a "Recovering" alcoholic (item #94). Alcohol admissions include but are not limited to (items # 20, 51, 56). Recommendations: consider outpatient group counseling augmented by Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) meetings.

DRUGS SCALE: MAXIMUM RISK RANGE **RISK PERCENTILE: 90**
Many self-report indicators of drug use or abuse are evident. Check the client's answer to the "recovering" question #100. Serious drug-related problems are indicated. If recovering, relapse risk is high. Recommendations: Monitored outpatient or inpatient chemical dependency treatment. Supplemental attendance at Narcotics Anonymous (NA) or Cocaine Anonymous (CA). A serious drug problem is present.

ENTITLEMENT SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE **RISK PERCENTILE: 74**
This client is entitlement oriented. Their "entitlement rationalizations" are used to justify their life situation and behavior. Recommendations: Clarifications of expectations, responsibility and consequences is needed. This individual's score provides considerable insight into this person's situation, goals and lifestyle. Group "awareness" counseling should be considered.

PEER PRESSURE SCALE: LOW RISK RANGE **RISK PERCENTILE: 38**
This client's score is in the Low Risk (zero to 39th percentile) range. Low risk scorers are not easily influenced by their peers (age equals friends and associates). This individual has good social awareness, an intact identity and a balanced sense of personal responsibility. Peer pressure is not a focal issue.

ANTI SOCIAL SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE **RISK PERCENTILE: 81**
This person's score is in the problem (70 to 89th percentile) range. Antisocial thinking and attitudes are evident. These individual's are usually callous, unfriendly, hostile and opposed to societies regulations and laws. Recommendation: Look for other elevated (70th percentile or higher) scale scores. Outpatient group counseling might be considered. If violent arrests are present consider more structured supervision.

SELF-ESTEEM SCALE: PROBLEM RISK RANGE **RISK PERCENTILE: 73**
This client's score is in the problem (70 to 89th percentile) range. Low or impaired self-esteem is evident. Negative self-esteem reflects a disapproving and rejecting attitude towards self. Recommendations: Group counseling combined with emotional support of endeavors and lifestyle adjustment are warranted.
